Sumer-an area in southern Mesopotamia

Most people were farmers.

Many city-states=city (urban) and surrounding areas (rural)

Wanted more land—so had strong armies, thick walls, fought each other.

Gilgamesh--legendary king in Sumerian Literature-1st superhero

Akkadians-new society and people

Sargon-king-1st to have a permanent army. Conquered all of Mesopotamia

1st empire-many lands and people under one ruler After he died-many invaders/fighting

Sumarians finally regain control (Ur)

Polytheism-worshipped many gods

Each city had a god protector Pleasing the gods brought success Priests interpreted the god's wishes Social hierarchy= Social order
(Division of society by rank or class)
